We have loved the past months with him and can't thank you enough for bringing him into our lives. Here's some pictures of him on different walks!



JETTY




Hi Louise,

You probably won't remember him, but we
adopted Milo, a 4-year-old blackie, from
you back in March 2020. It was a couple of
weeks before the COVID lockdown when we
picked him up from Chessington, so we just
managed to sneak in! He has been
absolutely brilliant; we got him over his
problems with children and he has been the
most wonderful and steady boy.

While we were in France in January we noticed a small swelling on his lower jaw under his tongue, so we took him to our vet there. Sadly, it is a tumour which has grown rapidly since then and is inoperable. In himself he is absolutely normal, he has no pain and is has just as much energy as always. We are back home now, and the tumour is still growing – it is now pushing out his lower front teeth, but he is still himself, eating and running around quite normally. We saw our vet last week, and we are all agreed that we will let him go on until there are any signs of discomfort, infection or difficulty eating etc, at which time we will have to say goodbye and let him cross the rainbow bridge. We are absolutely devastated; it has come as a real shock. We don't know how long it will be, days or weeks, but I thought I would like to let you know now rather than waiting till the day.

I am sorry it is such bad news; we are heartbroken.


He has been such a good boy. He was clean overnight, slept in his bed and has been playful and happy. He loves absolutely loves walking around with a toy in his mouth...

ARE YOU WORTH COMING BACK TO?



COMING BACK WHEN CALLED IS FAR MORE LIKELY WHEN IT'S REWARDING

COMMON REASONS DOGS DON'T COME BACK

ANGRY TONE

Would you want to go back to someone calling you with an angry voice?

Use a happy, excited, upbeat tone of voice to call your dog

INTERRUPTING

If a dog has just found a really interesting smell - a response is less likely

Why not wait a bit ? Set dogs up to be successful / get it right

Avoid calling **only** when the fun is ending

FUN IS ENDING

Call your dog back to you **during** an activity praise /reward then continue

REPEATING

Repeated calling = loss of interest / white noise Call once or twice, whistle / clap / run in the opposite direction, give lots of encouragement

SCOLDING / PUNISHMENT

Shouting / punishing dogs when they do come back creates fear / anxiety

COMING BACK = BAD THINGS HAPPEN

Always praise/reward even if it takes longer than it should

LOCATION, LOCATION!

1st practise in low distraction areas - play hide & seek inside then try outside - reward with praise / treats / toys /games when your dog finds you

Always reward dogs for coming back & keep on practicing Make sure you are worth coming back to!
