
We've had a great first year with Ray and we're very lucky that he has come into our lives. Thanks for bringing us together.


Hi Sue,

We went abroad for a few weeks last month, and he stayed with a family nearby. He appeared to cope with this well and seemed happy to be home again when we got back.






Hi Sue,


