
Hi Sue! The latest development with the girls.. I'm really pleased about how they are getting on.. Ebony is happy for Una to budge in for a cuddle!


So, home now and I have been told that we have to knuckle down to do some training. I am sure it will be lots of fun.


That's all for now but I'll write again soon.

Dog Friendly Cup Cakes

Ingredients:

- 125ml sunflower or olive oil
- 150ml honey
- 140g of dog friendly peanut butter (make sure it is xylitol-free)
- 2 eggs, whisked
- 240g wholewheat flour, sifted
- 2 tsp baking soda
- 225g carrots, grated

Method:

- Pre-heat oven to 180 deg C
- Combine oil, honey, peanut butter and eggs in a bowl and mix well
- Add the flour, baking soda, carrots and mix
- Grease a muffin tray with a dab of sunflower or olive oil and spoon the mixture into the muffin tray
- Bake for 20-25mins
- Once out of the oven, cool on a cooling rack before giving them to your dog

You can finish them off by topping with extra peanut butter and other dogfriendly toppings such as strawberries, bananas and apples

Hi Sue,






